WO. Rau Missing

WO. Orville Jack Rau. 34, of the Iroquois Squadron, RCAF, has been missing since air operations over Germany Jan. 14, 1945, his mother, Mrs. Margaret Jane Rau, 23 Shannon St., has been informed. A letter from his wing commander says. that WO. Rau was the squadron's "ace air-gunner, and had spent 75 hours flying time over enemy territory." WO. Rau was one of the members of the Precision Squad from Manning Depot, Toronto, which visited Niagara Falls and New York early in 1942.

He enlisted in March, 1942, and after training at Toronto, Guelph, Quebec City and Mont Joli, where he graduated in June, 1943, he went overseas on June 26. WO. Rau is the son of Mrs. Margaret Rau and the late Ernest Rau, and was born in Toronto, where he attended Dewson St. School and Bloor Collegiate. He was employed as a surveyor before he enlisted.

He has two brothers, Herbert Arnold Rau, a veteran of the last war, and William P. Rau, and a sister, Ethel Rau, all of Toronto. WO. Rau was an enthusiastic yachtsman and won the CNR racing plaques for dinghy sailing for the National Yacht Club in 1928 and 1930.
