Dear Mr and Mrs Tomkinson,

13th April 1945.

We deeply regret that you will by now have heard from the Air Ministry that your son, Sergeant R. Tomkinson, No. 1750 has been posted 'Missing, believed Killed in Action' and we should like to offer you the deep sympathy of all in this Department.

This action has been taken in view of an official German report which was sent direct to the Air Ministry through the International Red Cross Committee at Geneva.

This report states that your son's body was recovered from the shore at Domburg and that he was laid to rest in Grave No. 245 in the Municipal Cemetery at Flushing.

We are most distressed that your great anxiety should only end with such sad news.
