In the administration of the town-hall in Breskens there is a report of the chief of the office against air-attacks in these words:

To-day, the 14th April 1941 about 12.30 hours came over Breskens (from the East in South-West direction) an English airplane, followed by two German airplanes. After an airfight the English plane crashed down burning.

There were three persons in the plane, who died all.

The German Army lined off the ground and seized the fired plane.
