

learned of that and realized that the Sgt. could not bail out, so the crash landed the plane a few miles to the west. In the fighting over inter communicating radios were knocked out. I went up to the pilots compartment to learn what was happening and was ordered to bail out. So I ordered Sgt Mayo out. We were the only two in the nose of the plane in front of the pilots compartment. They learned of the radio Sgt's plight after they ordered us out.

The rest you will remember. Not long after I met you and your sister, I tried to hide in the ditches by the rd. But I was discovered by two of your police who had been sent out to find us by the Germans. I remember well how nice the 10 or 12 police were to me as we waited for the Germans to pick me up. I also remember the Supt. of the Quarters who came in for a couple of minutes and said in English that he was sorry I was caught. I believe you later told me he was the head of the underground.

We are enjoying life in Hawaii and we are in good health. However, I am now 65 and will become 66 on Jan 30, 1985. Mary will be 62 in Dec 84.

Give our best to all. I wish we could come to Holland again before we die - But I'm not sure we ever will be able to afford to.
