19th September 1944

As part of operation 'Market Garden' 16 Stirling IV RAF aircraft of 295 Squadron left RAF Harwell Berkshire during a daylight operation to resupply troops that had landed in the Arnhem area of Holland.



The planes encountered heavy opposition and many of the planes were severely damaged.

On the return journey plane LK170, piloted by Flight Sergeant Hall, was hit by flak and crashed near the village of Eede. All eight occupants were killed.

The remains of Alfred Wheeler were recovered and now rest in The Canadian Cemetery, Adegem.

The rest of the crew remain with their plane in the fields of Eede.

19 september 1944

Als onderdeel van operatie ‘Market Garden’ verlieten 16 Stirling IV RAF-vliegtuigen van 295 Squadron RAF Harwell Berkshire tijdens een operatie bij daglicht om troepen te bevoorraden die in de omgeving van Arnhem waren geland.



De vliegtuigen ondervonden hevige tegenstand en veel vliegtuigen raakten zwaar beschadigd.

Op de terugreis werd vliegtuig LK170, bestuurd door Flight Sergeant Hall, geraakt door luchtafweergeschut en stortte neer nabij het dorp Eede. Alle acht inzittenden kwamen om.

De stoffelijke resten van Alfred Wheeler werden teruggevonden en rusten nu op de Canadese begraafplaats, Adegem.

De rest van de bemanning blijft met hun vliegtuig in de velden van Eede.
